## **Volunteer Guidelines**

- 1. Volunteers must fill out an application. For prior volunteers, if the former application is no longer on file, a new application must be submitted.
- 2. Volunteers are typically scheduled for two-hour time periods, once per week.
- 3. The Library may not be able to accommodate last minute scheduling for those needing volunteer hours.
- 4. Regular Library volunteers must be at least 14 years of age. \*See 8 and 9 below for alternative opportunities for young teens.
- 5. Volunteers must dress appropriately. Many volunteer tasks require reaching, bending, stooping, kneeling, crawling, etc. As a rule of thumb, if clothing cannot be worn at school, then it should not be worn to volunteer. The Volunteer Coordinator may be contacted with questions regarding proper dress.
- 6. Volunteers must conduct themselves in a suitable manner. Please refrain from excessive cell phone usage, excessive talking with other volunteers, etc.
- 7. Failure to follow volunteer guidelines may result in the volunteer not receiving credit for hours they have worked.
- 8. For students in grades 6-12, the Library Ambassador Program is a group of up to 20 teens who share a desire to promote reading, can work cooperatively with others, and are committed to attend meetings and programs on a regular basis. A special application form must be completed and is generally available in August. The program runs from September through April.
- 9. For students ages 12 -18, Summer Reading Program teen volunteers record participants reading progress and hand out prizes. A special application form must be completed and is generally available in April.
